

## Proposition 40

Proposition 40 was a state bond passed by California voters in November 2002. Each municipality (e.g., city, county, recreation and park district) received a "per-capita" allotment in the form of reimbursement for projects that met the guidelines specified by the bond act. In addition, through a competitive grant process additional "Roberti-Z'berg" funding was granted to some municipalities for specific projects. Here's what Chico received in Prop 40 funding and how it's been spent so far.

\* At the December 28, 2009 Bidwell Park and Playground Commission meeting, General Services Director Dennis Beardsley indicated that \$7,000 of the remaining Prop 40 monies would be allocated to Children's Park.
